





Philips Selecon's SPX Zoomspot Profiles have made a splash on the catwalk for Africa Fashion International (AFI) Fashion Week.



Lighting designer Mauritz Jacobs specified the luminaires because of the accuracy with which they control light distribution, the well-defined beam and because there is never any unwanted light spill.







When using the shutter functionality on the SPX, you can shutter the light off on a sharp edge, and when you take it out of focus the line will actually still remain straight but just softly focused on the sides."






The SPXs were used close together above the catwalk to ensure there were no darkspots. "This set up can be a nightmare for me," continues Jacobs. "The degree level at which the lights hang is crucial to avoid any unwanted shadows under the eyes and chin. For me, the Selecon SPX is undoubtedly the best choice for this application."





"The luminaires are ideal for a show where a bright, precise even coverage is required," continues Duncan Riley, managing director of DWR, the Philips Selecon distributor for South Africa. "They offer up to 63% more light than the current industry benchmark and are designed to efficiently manage the power and heat from high output tungsten halogen 800W light sources. They boast a 'crisp' white light untainted by hues or colour cast, and a premium optical lens package."
