




Despite the very wet weather, usually a power nightmare for technicians, the festival ran without a mishap.

The Dot 2 was launched to cover a requirement for a budget-constrained console that still had both the power and reliability of the MA stable. This heady combination of MA power combined with the legendary reliability of a LINEX based console has proved to be a total winner for both MA and its South African representatives, DWR Distribution.
